21. We all scream for ice cream! For a cool treat, visit Love Creamery in Duluth, Cup and Cone in White Bear Lake, and What's the Scoop? in Buffalo and St. Michael.
22. Eat at a drive-in! Stop by <b>Peppermint Twist</b> in <b>Delano</b> for a shake. Make sure to save extra time for the Teddy Bear Park!
23. See a movie at a drive-in! <b>Vali-Hi</b> in <b>Lake Elmo</b> , <b>Long Drive In Theater</b> in <b>Long Prairie</b> , and <b>Starlite Drive-In Theater</b> in <b>Litchfield</b> are all classic drive-ins showing movies under the stars.

25. Stop by <b>Nisswa</b> for <b>Turtle Races</b> , which take place every Wednesday. The tradition started in 1963.
26. After a few years off, <b>Sparky the Sea Lion</b> is back performing at <b>Como Park Zoo and Conservatory</b> in <b>Saint Paul</b> . Best of all, admission to Como is free. If you're hungry, stop by nearby <b>Nelson Cheese &amp; Deli</b> for an amazing sandwich.
27. Watch water ski stunts by the <b>Twin Cities River Rats</b> along the banks of the Mississippi River in northeast Minneapolis. Shows are Thursday nights in June and July. Grab a pint of beer on the patio of <b>Pryes Brewing Company</b> before.



28. Rent out the <b>Mpls Water Taxi</b> with your friends and family for a unique view of the Mississippi River and downtown Minneapolis.
29. Discover Minnesota grown at farmers markets! The market in <b>Edina</b> runs Thursday afternoons through September.
