**About the Research / Filtering:** SurveyUSA interviewed 825 adults from the state of Minnesota 04/03/24 through 04/07/24. Of the adults, 721 were identified as being registered to vote and were asked the questions which follow. This research was conducted online, using nonprobability sample of online adult panelists chosen randomly by Lucid Holdings LLC of New Orleans. The combined pool of survey respondents was weighted to US Census CPS targets for gender, age, race, and education; to US Census ACS targets for home ownership, and to recalled 2020 presidential vote.
