As Voting Begins, Harris Leads Trump by 6 pts in Latest MN Polling; Harris Voters 12 pts More Enthusiastic Than Trump's; Vance a Drag on Ticket:

SurveyUSA's freshly released exclusive polling for KSTP-TV Minneapolis, KAAL-TV Rochester, and WDIO-TV Duluth shows Democrat Kamala Harris defeating Republican Donald Trump 50% to 44% in an election today, 40 days until votes are counted. That's a nominal 1-point gain from last month, when Harris at 48%, Trump at 43%.

Month on month, Trump has gained <u>among men</u>, where he had led by just 6 points in August, but now leads by 12; Harris, meantime, has increased her lead <u>among women</u>, from 18 points to 24 points. Combined, that increases the gender gap among likely Minnesota voters from 24 points in August to 36 points, the widest it's been since Harris entered the race.

Voting began in Minnesota on September 20, and among the small number of voters who tell SurveyUSA they have already cast their ballot, Harris leads by 30 points, 58% to 28%. Among those who say they are certain to cast a ballot but have not yet done so, Harris leads by 8. Trump, on the other hand, leads by 23 points among the 11% of likely voters who say they will probably vote this year. That may connect to an enthusiasm gap; while 71% of all voters who are not undecided say they cast their ballots enthusiastically this year, and 23% say they do so with reservations, Harris voters have an edge here: 75% of those voting for the Vice President say they do so enthusiastically, 20% with reservations & dash; a 55-point enthusiasm margin. Among those voting for the former President, 68% say they do so enthusiastically, 25% with reservations & dash; a 43-point margin. By SurveyUSA's calculations, this means Harris voters are 12 point more enthusiastic about voting for their candidate than Trump voters are & dash; a gap that may prove very significant, especially when combined with the fact 77% of Trump voters say they plan to vote on Election Day, compared to 60% of Harris voters.

Another gap between the Presidential candidates is the impact of their running mates on the campaigns: while Kamala Harris' selection of Minnesota Governor Tim Walz is viewed positively by most in the North Star State, with 50% saying he was an excellent (37%) or good (13%) choice and 46% saying he was a fair (9%) or poor (37%) choice & ndash; a net score of +4, down 2 points from +6 last month & ndash; Donald Trump's selection of Ohio Senator JD Vance was unpopular when first announced and is <u>becoming more so</u>, falling from a -14 in July to a -17 in August and a -26 today, with 32% saying he was an excellent (16%) or good (16%) choice and 58% saying he was a fair (17%) or poor (41%) choice. Among Harris voters, the selection of Walz has a net rating of +82, with 69% of Harris voters saying Walz was an excellent pick; among Trump voters, the selection of Vance has a net rating of +34, with 35% of Trump voters saying Vance was an excellent pick.

Elsewhere on the ballot, Democratic Senator Amy Klobuchar is well-positioned to win a 4th term, defeating former NBA player Republican Royce White by 18 points today, 53% to 35%, an increase from 14 points <u>last month</u>. Klobuchar, at 53%, is running 3 points ahead of Kamala Harris at the top of the ticket, while White, at 35%, is running 9 points behind Donald Trump.

DFL candidates also have the edge in generic balloting for Minnesota House seats, where they lead by 4 points, 47% to 43% today. Republicans held the edge this spring, but DFL candidates have been ahead since June.

About the Research / Filtering: SurveyUSA interviewed 800 adults from the state of Minnesota 09/23/24 through 09/26/24. Of the adults, 708 were identified as being registered to vote; of the registered voters, 646 were determined by SurveyUSA to be likely to vote in the November general election and were asked the substantive questions which follow. This research was conducted online, using nonprobability sample of online adult panelists chosen randomly by Lucid Holdings LLC of New Orleans. The combined pool of survey respondents was weighted to US Census ACS targets for gender, age, race, education, and home ownership, and to recalled 2020 presidential vote.
